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Assembling

Unpack

Check your product box for the following items:

- Travel adapter (charger)

Install the SIM or USIM card and battery

When you subscribe to a cellular service, you will receive a Subscriber Identity Module (SIM) card, with subscription details, such as your personal identification number (PIN) and optional services. To use UMTS or HSDPA services, you can purchase a Universal Subscriber Identity Module (USIM) card.

To install the SIM or USIM card and battery,

7 Remove the back cover.




2 Insert the SIM or USIM card.





- Place the SIM or USIM card into the device with the gold-coloured contacts facing down.
- If you do not insert a SIM or USIM card, you can only use your device's non-network services and some menus.
- 3 Insert the battery.



4 Replace the back cover.



Charge the battery

Before using the device for the first time, you must charge the battery.

You can charge the device with the provided travel adapter or by connecting the device to a PC with a PC data cable.



Use only Samsung-approved chargers and cables. Unauthorised chargers or cables can cause batteries to explode or damage your device.



When your battery is low, the device will emit a warning tone and display a low battery message. The battery icon will also be empty. If the battery level becomes too low, the device will automatically power off. Recharge your battery to continue using your device.

Charge with the travel adapter

- Open the cover of the multifunction jack.
- Plug the small end of the travel adapter into the multifunction jack.



Improperly connecting the travel adapter can cause serious damage to the device. Any damage caused by misuse is not covered by the warranty.

Plug the large end of the travel adapter into a power outlet



- You can use the device while it is charging, but it may take longer to fully charge the battery.
- While the device is charging, the touch screen may not function due to an unstable power supply. If this happens, unplug the travel adapter from the device.
- While charging, the device may heat up. This is normal and should not affect your device's lifespan or performance.
- If your device is not charging properly, bring your device and the charger to a Samsung Service Centre
- When the battery is fully charged, unplug the travel adapter from the device and then from the power outlet.
- Do not remove the battery before removing the travel adapter. Doing this may cause damage to the device.

Assembling

Charge with the PC data cable

Before charging, ensure that your PC is turned on.

- Open the cover of the multifunction jack.
- Plug one end (micro-USB) of the PC data cable into the multifunction iack.
- Plug the other end of the PC data cable into a USB port on a PC.



Depending on the type of PC data cable you are using, it may take some time before charging begins.

When the battery is fully charged, unplug the PC data cable from the device and then from the PC.

Getting started

Turn your device on and off

To turn on your device,

- Press and hold [(')].
- Enter the PIN supplied with your SIM or USIM card and select enter (if necessary).
- If you turn on your device for the first time, follow the on-screen instructions to set up your device. You can log in to Windows Live or create a Windows Live account to use applications that interact with the Windows Live server


To turn off your device, press and hold [()].




- Follow all posted warnings and directions from official personnel when in areas where the use of wireless devices is restricted, such as aeroplanes and hospitals.
- To use your device's non-network services only, switch to Flight mode. In Menu mode, select Settings → flight mode.

Use the touch screen

Your device's touch screen lets you easily select items or perform functions. Learn basic actions to use the touch screen.



- To avoid scratching the touch screen, do not use sharp tools.
- Do not allow the touch screen to come into contact with other electrical devices. Flectrostatic discharges can cause the touch screen to malfunction.
- Do not allow the touch screen to come into contact with water. The touch screen may malfunction in humid conditions or when exposed to water.



- For optimal use of the touch screen, remove the screen protection film before using your device.
- Your touch screen has a layer that detects small electrical charges emitted by the human body.
 For best performance, tap the touch screen with your fingertip. The touch screen will not react to touches of sharp tools, such as a stylus or pen.

Control your touch screen with the following actions:

- Tap: Touch once with your finger to select or launch a menu, option, or application.
- Tap and hold: Tap an item and hold it for more than 2 seconds to open a pop-up option list.
- Drag: Tap and drag your finger up, down, left, or right to move to items on lists or scroll through screens.
- Drag and drop: Tap and hold your finger on an item, and then drag your finger to move the item.
- Double-tap: Tap twice quickly with your finger to zoom in or out while viewing photos or web pages.

 Area zoom: Place two fingers on the screen and spread them apart (move your fingers closer together to zoom out).



- Your device turns off the touch screen when you
 do not use the device for a specified period. To
 turn on the screen, press [(')].
- You can set the length of time the device waits before turning off the screen. In Menu mode, select Settings → lock & wallpaper → Screen time-out.

Lock or unlock the touch screen and keys

You can lock the touch screen and keys to prevent any unwanted device operations. Press [*\mathcal{O}] to lock the touch screen and keys. To unlock, turn on the screen by pressing [*\mathcal{O}], and drag the lock screen up with your finger.

Get to know the Start screen

When the device is in Idle mode, you will see the Start screen. From the Start screen, you can view your device's status and access applications.

Add items to the Start screen

You can customise the Start screen by adding shortcuts to applications or items in applications. To add items to the Start screen, tap and hold on the item and select **pin** to start.

Move items on the Start screen

- / Tap and hold an item to move.
- 2 Drag the item to the location you want when the item is magnified.

Remove items from the Start screen

- Tap and hold an item to remove.
- 2 Select ℜ.

Access applications

- I In Idle mode, select igota to access Menu mode.
- 2 Select an application.
- 3 Press [←] to return to the previous screen; Press [#] to return to the Start screen.

Uninstall applications

You can uninstall add-on applications.

- In Menu mode, tap and hold an application.
- 2 Select uninstall.
- Follow the on-screen instructions.

Customise your device

Get more from your device by customising it to match your preferences.

- Change the language of the display
- In Menu mode, select Settings → region & language → Display language.
- 2 Select a language you want.
- Set the current time and date
- In Menu mode, select Settings → date & time.
- 2 Select your time zone, set the time and date, and change other options.

Adjust the device volume

In Idle mode, press [+/-] to adjust the volume of sounds.

Switch to Silent mode

To mute or unmute your device, press [+/-] and select ring.

- Change your ringtone
- In Menu mode, select Settings → ringtones & sounds → Ringtone.
- 2 Select a ringtone from the list.
- 3 To play the ringtone before setting, select lacktriangle.

- Change the display theme
- In Menu mode, select **Settings** → **theme**.
- Select colours for the background and the highlight.
- Adjust the brightness of the display
- In Menu mode, select **Settings** → **brightness**.
- Clear the box next to **Automatically adjust**.
- Select **Level** \rightarrow a brightness level.

The brightness level of the display will affect how quickly the device consumes battery power.

Lock your device

You can lock your device by activating the device password.

- In Menu mode, select **Settings** → **lock & wallpaper**.
- Select **change wallpaper** \rightarrow an image folder \rightarrow an image.
- Adjust the area to crop and select \checkmark .
- Select **Screen time-out** \rightarrow a length of time.
- Select the box next to **Password**.
- Enter a new 4-digit password, enter the new password again, and select done.



The first time you access a menu that requires a password, you will be prompted to create and confirm a password.

Once the device lock is enabled, you must enter the password each time you turn on the device or unlock the touch screen.



- If you forget your password, bring your device to a Samsung Service Centre to unlock it.
- Samsung is not responsible for any loss of passwords or private information or other damages caused by illegal software.

Lock your SIM or USIM card

You can lock your device by activating the PIN supplied with your SIM or USIM card.

- In Menu mode, select Settings → applications → phone.
- Select the box next to SIM security.
- 3 Enter your PIN.

Once the PIN lock is enabled, you must enter the PIN each time you turn on the device.



- If you enter an incorrect PIN too many times, your SIM or USIM card will be blocked. You must enter a PIN unlock key (PUK) to unblock the SIM or USIM card
- If you block your SIM or USIM card by entering an incorrect PUK, bring the card to your service provider to unblock it.

Enter text

You can enter text by selecting characters on the virtual keypad.



You cannot enter text in some languages. To enter text, you should change the writing language to one of the supported languages. ▶ p. 61

Enter text by selecting alphanumeric keys on the screen. You can also use the following keys:

Search for information with Bing

You can search for information from websites and applications or files from your device by using the Bing service.

- Press [O].The Bing search screen opens.
- 2 Select the keyword field, enter a keyword, and select

Communication

Calling

Learn to use calling functions, such as making and answering calls, using options available during a call or customising and using call-related features.

Make and answer a call

You can use the buttons or the touch screen when you make, accept, end, or reject calls.



When you hold the device near your face, your device automatically turns off and locks the touch screen to prevent accidental inputs.

Make a call

- In Menu mode, select **Phone** → (iii), and enter an area code and a phone number.
- 2 Select call to make a call.
 - To end the call, select **end call**.



- Use the phonebook to save numbers you dial frequently. ► p. 41
- To quickly access the call log to redial the numbers you dialled recently, select **Phone**.
- Use the voice command feature to dial by voice.
 ▶ p. 58

Answer a call

1 When a call comes in, select answer.



When the device is ringing, press [+/-] to mute the ringtone.

To end the call, select end call.

Reject a call

When a call comes in, select **ignore**. The caller will hear a busy tone.

Call an international number

- In Menu mode, select **Phone** → (iii), and tap and hold
 0 to insert the + character.
- 2 Enter the complete number you want to dial (country code, area code and phone number), and then select call to dial the number.

Use the headset

By plugging the supplied headset into the device, you can control calls hands-free;

- To answer a call, press the headset button.
- To reject a call, press and hold the headset button.

To end a call, press the headset button.



The supplied headset is designed only for your device and may not be compatible with other devices.

Use options during a voice call

You can use the following options while a voice call is in progress:

- To adjust the voice volume, press [+/-].
- To place a call on hold, select III. To retrieve a held call, select III again.
- To dial a second call, select add call and then dial a new number.

- To answer a second call, select answer when a call
 waiting tone sounds. The first call is automatically placed
 on hold. You must subscribe to the call waiting service to
 use this feature.
- To open the dialling screen, select (iii).
- To activate the speakerphone feature, select **speaker**.



In noisy environments, you may have difficulty hearing some calls while using the speakerphone feature. For better audio performance, use the normal phone mode.

- To turn off the microphone so that the other party cannot hear you, select **mute**.
- To make a multiparty call (conference call), make or answer a second call and select merge calls when connected to the second party. Repeat to add more parties. You must subscribe to the multiparty call service to use this feature.
- To open the phonebook, select **S**.
- To switch between the two calls, select **PRESS TO SWAP**.

View and dial missed calls

Your device will display calls you have missed. To dial the number of a missed call, select the missed call notification.

Messaging

Learn to create and send text (SMS) or multimedia (MMS) messages, and view or manage messages you have sent or received.



You may incur additional charges for sending or receiving messages while outside your home service area. For details, contact your service provider.

Send a text message

- In Menu mode, select **Messaging** → (+).
- 2 Select
 on the recipient field and select a contact, or enter a number manually.

- 3 Select the text field and enter your message text.
- 4 Select to send the message.

Send a multimedia message

- In Menu mode, select **Messaging** \rightarrow +.
- 2 Select

 on the recipient field and select a contact, or enter a number manually.
- 3 Select the text field and enter your message text.
- 4 Select (1) and add an image.
 To capture a new photo, select (2).
- 5 Select to send the message.

View a text or multimedia message

- In Menu mode, select Messaging.
 Your messages are grouped by contact as a message thread.
- 2 Select a contact.
- 3 Select a text or multimedia message from the message thread.

From the message view, use the following options:

- To reply to the message, select the text input field, enter your message text, and select to send the message.
- To forward the message to other people, tap and hold and select forward.
- To delete the message, tap and hold and select **delete**.

Listen to voice mail messages

If you have set missed calls to be diverted to the voice mail server, callers may leave voice messages when you do not answer incoming calls. To access your voice mail inbox and listen to voice mail messages,

In Menu mode, select **Phone** \rightarrow \bigcirc .

2 Follow the instructions from the voice mail server.



You must save the voice mail server number before accessing the server. Your service provider can give you the number.

Email

Learn to send or view email messages via your personal or company email account.

> Set up an email account

- In Menu mode, select **People**.
- 2 Scroll left or right to what's new and select set up account.
- 3 Select one of general email services or advanced setup.
- 4 Follow the on-screen instructions.

When you are finished setting up the email account, the email account is added to Menu mode and the email messages are downloaded to your device.

Send an email message

- In Menu mode, select an email account $\rightarrow \bigoplus$.
- 2 Select

 on the recipient field and select a contact, or enter an email address manually.

- 3 Select the subject field and enter a subject.
- 4 Select the text field and enter your email text.
- 5 Select (a) and attach a file.
 To capture a new photo, select (a).
- 6 Select ¹ to send the message.
- 7 Select (2) to send and receive messages.

 If you are offline or outside your service area, the

message will be held in the message thread list until you are online and in your service area.

View an email message

When you open an email account, you can view previously retrieved messages offline or retrieve new messages.

- In Menu mode, select and email account.
- 2 Select (2) to update the message list.

- Select \longrightarrow **show all folders** \rightarrow a message folder.
- 4 Select an email message.

From the message view, use the following options:

- To reply to the message, select 🗐.
- To delete the message, select (m).
- To view other messages in the current folder, select € or ♠).
- To access additional features, select
 - toggle flag: Add a flag to the message.
 - mark unread: Mark the message as unread.
 - **move**: move the message to another folder.

> Customise the email settings

- In Menu mode, select an email account.
- 2 Select ···· → Settings.

Adjust the following settings to customise the email account.

Option	Function
sync settings	Set the options for synchronising messages your device and the email server.
Use an email signature	Set whether or not to add your signature to your outgoing messages and enter your signature.

When you are finished, select **done**.



Entertainment

Camera

Learn how to capture and view photos and videos. You can capture photos at resolutions up to 2560 x 1920 pixels (5 megapixels) and record videos at resolutions up to 1280 x 720 pixels.



- The camera interface appears only in the landscape orientation.
- The camera automatically turns off when you do not use it for a specified period.
- The memory capacity may differ depending on the shooting scene or shooting conditions.

Capture a photo

- In Idle mode, press and hold [1] to turn on the camera
- 2 Rotate the device anti-clockwise to landscape view.
- 3 Select **allow** to use location services for the camera.



You will be prompted when you turn on the camera for the first time.

4 Aim the lens at the subject and make any necessary adjustments.

0	Switch to the camcorder.
2	Zoom in or out.
3	Change the camera settings.

- 6 Press [] to capture a photo.
 The photo is saved automatically.

After capturing photos, drag your finger from the left to the right to view the captured photos.

- To view more photos, scroll left.
- To zoom in or out, place two fingers on the screen and spread them apart (move your fingers closer together to zoom out) or double-tap the screen.

- To use additional features, tap and hold on the screen and select one of the following options:
 - add to favourites: Set a photo as your favourites.
 - delete: Delete a photo.
 - upload to SkyDrive: Upload a photo to the SkyDrive storage.
 - share...: Send a photo to others.
 - use as wallpaper: Set a photo as wallpaper for the lock screen.

Customise camera settings

Before capturing a photo, select (a) to access the following options:

Record a video

- Idle mode, press and hold [1 to turn on the camera.
- 2 Rotate the device anti-clockwise to landscape view.
- 3 Select to switch to the camcorder.

4 Aim the lens at the subject and make any necessary adjustments.

Pictures

Learn to view photos and play videos you captured. Your device supports the following file formats: .jpg, .png, .bmp, .gif, .mp4.

- If the file size exceeds the available memory, an error can occur when you open files.

View a photo

- In Menu mode, select Pictures.
- 2 Flick right to the thumbnail list and select a photo. You can also select a folder (all, date, or favorites) and then a photo.

While viewing photos, use the following options:

 To zoom in or out, tap the screen with two fingers and spread them apart (move your fingers closer together to zoom out) or double-tap the screen.




- To use additional features, tap and hold on the screen and select one of the following options:
 - add to favourites: Set a photo as your favourites.
 - delete: Delete a photo.
 - upload to SkyDrive: Upload a photo to SkyDrive storage.
 - share...: Send a photo to others.
 - use as wallpaper: Set a photo as wallpaper for the lock screen.

Play a video

- / In Menu mode, select **Pictures**.
- 2 Flick right to the thumbnail list and select a video (with the) icon) to play.
 - You can also select a folder (all or date) and then a video.
- 3 Rotate the device anti-clockwise to landscape view.

- Control playback with the following keys:

Music & Videos

Learn to play your favourite music and video and listen to the FM radio while on the go. Your device supports the following file formats: .mp3, .wma, .wmv, .3gp, .mp4, .avi.

- If the file size exceeds the available memory, an error can occur when you open files.

Add music files to your device

You can synchronise Zune on your PC to add music and video files to your device.

Using an optional PC data cable, connect the multifunction jack on your device to a PC with Zune installed.

When connected, Zune will automatically run on the PC.

- Customise the sync settings and set your device's name by following the on-screen instructions.
- From the Zune screen, access your collection list.
- Select and drag the music or videos files you want to the device icon at the bottom left of the screen.



To disconnect the device to the PC, click the USB device icon on the Windows task bar and click the option to safely remove the device. Then remove the PC data cable from the PC. Otherwise, you may lose data stored on your device.

Play music

After transferring music files to your device,

- / In Menu mode, select **Music & Videos**.
- Scroll to zune and select music.
- 3 Scroll left or right to a music category.
- 4 Select a music file.

Play a podcast

- In Menu mode, select Music & Videos.
- 2 Scroll to zune and select podcasts.
- 3 Scroll left or right to a music or video category.
- 4 Select a podcast \rightarrow an episode \rightarrow \triangleright .

Listen to the FM radio

Learn to listen to music and news on the FM radio. To listen to the FM radio, you must connect the supplied headset, which serves as the radio antenna.

- Plug the supplied headset into the device.
- 2 In Menu mode, select Music & Videos.

- Scroll to zune and select radio.
- 4 Control the FM radio with the following keys:

2	Change the frequency by scrolling left or right on the screen.

Tap and hold on the empty area below the scale bar and use the following options:

- pin to start: Add the current radio station to the Start screen.
- **settings**: Select a region for searching for FM radio stations and updating frequencies.
- radio mode: speaker/radio mode: headset: Change the sound output to the headset or device's speaker.

Use the mini player

When you exit Zune after playing music or listening to the FM radio, playback or the FM radio continues in the background. You can control the playback or FM radio by using the mini player.

- While music or FM radio is playing in the background, press [+/-].
 - The mini player appears at the top of the screen.
- 2 Control the playback or FM radio with the following keys:

Games

Learn to play games and download new games from the XBoxLive website.



The download of games may not be supported depending on the software of the device.

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communications technology capable of exchanging information over a distance of about 10 m without requiring a physical connection

You do not need to line up the devices to beam information with Bluetooth. If the devices are within range of one another, you can exchange information between them even if they are located in different rooms.

- Always ensure that you share and receive data with devices that are trusted and properly secured. If there are obstacles between the devices, the operating distance may be reduced.

Troubleshooting

When you turn on your device or while you are using the device, it prompts you to enter one of the following codes:

Code	Try this to solve the problem:

PIN	When using the device for the first time or when the PIN requirement is enabled, you must enter the PIN supplied with the SIM or USIM card. You can disable this feature by using the SIM security menu.

Code	Try this to solve the problem:
PUK	Your SIM or USIM card is blocked, usually as a result of entering your PIN incorrectly several times. You must enter the PUK supplied by your service provider.

Your device displays "Service unavailable" or "No service"

- When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose reception. Move to another area and try again.
- You cannot access some options without a subscription. Contact your service provider for more details.

The touch screen responds slowly or improperly

If your device has a touch screen and the touch screen is not responding properly, try the following:

- Remove any protective covers from the touch screen.
 Protective covers may prevent the device from recognising your inputs and are not recommended for touch screen devices.
- Ensure that your hands are clean and dry when tapping the touch screen.
- Restart your device to clear any temporary software bugs.
- Ensure that your device software is upgraded to the latest version

Your device freezes or has fatal errors

If your device freezes or hangs, you may need to close programs or reset the device to regain functionality. If your device is frozen and unresponsive, press and hold [49] for 8-10 seconds. The device will power off forcefully.

If this does not solve the problem, perform a factory data reset.

Calls are being dropped

Outgoing calls are not connected

Incoming calls are not connected

- Ensure that you have accessed the right cellular network.
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the incoming phone number.

Others cannot hear you speaking on a call

- Ensure that you are not covering the built-in microphone.
- Ensure that the microphone is close to your mouth.
- If using a headset, ensure that it is properly connected.

Audio quality is poor

- Ensure that you are not blocking the device's internal antenna.
- When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose reception. Move to another area and try again.

When dialling from contacts, the call is not connected

- Ensure that the correct number is stored in the contact list.
- Re-enter and save the number, if necessary.
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the contact's phone number.

The device beeps and the battery icon flashes

Your battery is low. Recharge or replace the battery to continue using the device.

The battery does not charge properly or the device turns off

 The battery terminals may be dirty. Wipe both goldcoloured contacts with a clean, soft cloth and try charging the battery again. If the battery will no longer charge completely, dispose
of the old battery properly and replace it with a new
battery (refer to your local ordinances for proper disposal
instructions).

Your device is hot to the touch

When you use applications that require more power or use applications on your device for an extended period of time, your device may feel hot to the touch. This is normal and should not affect your device's lifespan or performance.

Error messages appear when launching the FM radio

The FM radio application on your Samsung mobile device uses the headset cable as an antenna. Without a headset connected, the FM radio will be unable to receive radio stations. To use the FM radio, first ensure that the headset is properly connected. Next, scan for and save the available radio stations.

If you still cannot use the FM radio after performing these steps, try accessing your desired station with another radio receiver. If you can hear the station with another receiver, your device may require service. Contact a Samsung Service Centre.

Another Bluetooth device is not located

- Ensure that the Bluetooth feature is activated on your device.
- Ensure that the Bluetooth feature is activated on the device you wish to connect to, if necessary.
- Ensure that your device and the other Bluetooth device are within the maximum Bluetooth range (10 m).

If the tips above do not solve the problem, contact a Samsung Service Centre.

A connection is not established when you connect the device to a PC

- Ensure that the PC data cable you are using is compatible with your device.
- Ensure that you have the proper drivers installed and updated on your PC.

Safety precautions

To prevent injury to yourself and others or damage to your device, read all of the following information before using your device.

Warning: Prevent electric shock, fire, and explosion

Do not use damaged power cords or plugs, or loose electrical sockets

Do not touch the power cord with wet hands, or disconnect the charger by pulling on the cord

Do not handle a damaged or leaking Lithium Ion (Li-Ion) battery

- Let the person you are speaking with know you are driving. Suspend calls in heavy traffic or hazardous weather conditions. Rain, sleet, snow, ice, and heavy traffic can be hazardous.
- Do not take notes or look up phone numbers. Jotting down a "to do" list or flipping through your address book takes attention away from your primary responsibility of driving safely.
- Dial sensibly and assess the traffic. Place calls when you are not moving
 or before pulling into traffic. Try to plan calls when your car will be
 stationary. If you need to make a call, dial only a few numbers, check
 the road and your mirrors, then continue.
- Do not engage in stressful or emotional conversations that may be distracting. Make people you are talking with aware you are driving and suspend conversations that have the potential to divert your attention from the road.
