Installation Addendum: L6-30 Power Distribution Module Alarm Settings



Note: This is an addendum to your Power Distribution Module with L6-30 Output Installation sheet. It contains important information regarding the installation of the equipment. Read and follow the instructions below.

If the Alarm LED on the module is red and the breaker is ON following module installation, you must edit the alarm settings.



Note: This module has an unused phase. The breaker-position alarm for the unused phase must be disabled.

How to disable the module breaker-position alarm from the display interface

1. Select **Circuit Cfg** on the Main Menu screen and press ENTER.



Note: If **Circuit Cfg** is not on the Main Menu, select **Modules>Circuit Config**, and press ENTER.

2. Select **Individual Load Cfg** and press ENTER.

```

▶>Individual Load Cfg
>Mass Configuration
>Reset Ckt Defaults
>Electrical Config

```

3. Scroll to the desired **Module** and **Cable**.
m is the number of cables in the module (1 to 3).
Select **Alarm Configuration** and press ENTER.

```

Mod:>xx Cable:>yofm
<Circuit Name>
>Name/Location
▶>Alarm Configuration

4. Select **Alarm Thresholds** and press ENTER.

```

Mod xx, Cable y:
>Alarms: >Enabled
▶>Alarm Thresholds
>Reset to Defaults

```

5. Select **Position Alarms** and press ENTER.

```

Mod xx, Cable y:
>Warning Thresholds
>Critical Thresholds
▶>Position Alarms

```

6. Select the unused phase and disable it. The desired setting for PDM2330L6-12-xxx (which uses L1 and L2, but not L3) is shown.

```

Mod xx, Brkr Alarms:
▶>Lx: >Enabled
>Ly: >Enabled
>Lz: >Disabled

```

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
