Warnings

- Proper configuration of all passwords and other security settings is the responsibility of the installer and/or end-user.

Cautions

- If the camera fails to synchronize the local time with that of the network, you need to set the camera time manually. Visit the camera (via web browser or client software) and enter the system settings interface for the time settings.
- Make sure the power supply voltage is correct before using the camera.
- Do not drop the camera or subject it to physical shock.
- Do not touch sensor modules with fingers. If cleaning is necessary, use clean cloth with a bit of ethanol and wipe it gently. If the camera will not be used for an extended period, replace the lens cap to protect the sensor from dirt.
- Do not aim the camera at the sun or extra bright places. Blooming or smearing may occur otherwise (which is not a

malfunction), and affect the endurance of sensor at the same time.

- The sensor may be burned out by a laser beam, so when any laser equipment is in using, make sure that the surface of sensor will not be exposed to the laser beam.
- Do not place the camera in extremely hot, cold (the operating temperature shall be -30°C to $+60^{\circ}\text{C}$ if the camera model has an “H” in its suffix), dusty or damp locations, and do not expose it to high electromagnetic radiation.
- To avoid heat accumulation, good ventilation is required for operating environment.
- Keep the camera away from liquid while in use.
- While in delivery, the camera shall be packed in its original packing, or packing of the same texture.
- Regular part replacement: a few parts (e.g. electrolytic capacitor) of the equipment shall be replaced regularly according to their average enduring time. The average time varies because of differences between operating environment and using history, so regular checking is recommended for all the users. Contact with your dealer for more details.
- Improper use or replacement of the battery may result in hazard of explosion. Replace with the same or equivalent type only. Dispose of used batteries according to the instructions provided by the battery manufacturer.

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1 Appearance Description

This series of cameras has two types with the same appearance and different cable connections. The overview of the type I and type II cameras are shown below.

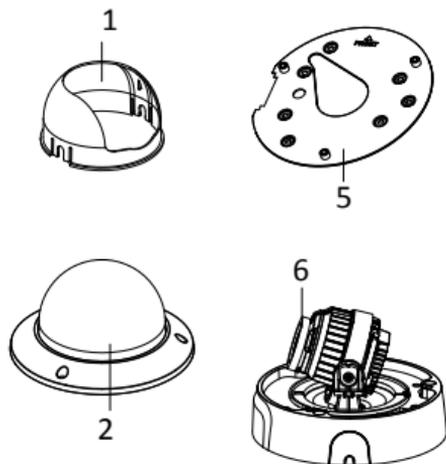


Figure 1-1 Appearance of Camera

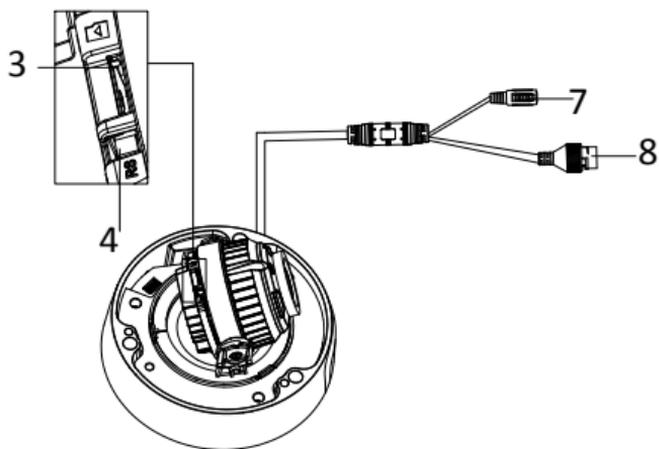


Figure 1-2 Cable Connection of Type I Camera

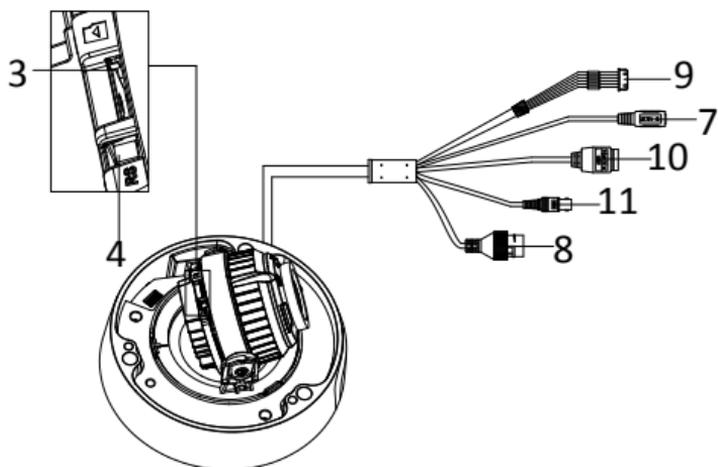


Figure 1-3 Cable Connection of Type II Camera

Notes:

- Power on the camera when pressing the RESET button, and press button for another 10 seconds to restore the default settings, including the user name, password, IP address, port No., etc.
- Only type II camera supports audio and alarm functions.

2 Installation

Before you start:

- Make sure the device in the package is in good condition and all the assembly parts are included.
- The standard power supply is 12 VDC or PoE (802.3af). Make sure your power supply matches with your camera.
- Make sure all the related equipment is power-off during the installation.
- Check the specification of the products for the installation environment.
- Make sure that the wall is strong enough to withstand four times the weight of the camera and the bracket.

For the camera that supports IR, you are required to pay attention to the following precautions to prevent IR reflection:

- Dust or grease on the bubble will cause IR reflection. Do not remove the bubble film until the installation is finished. If there is dust or grease on the bubble, clean the bubble with clean soft cloth and isopropyl alcohol.
- Make sure that there is no reflective surface too close to the camera lens. The IR light from the camera may reflect back into the lens causing reflection.
- The foam ring around the lens must be seated flush against the inner surface of the bubble to isolate the lens from the IR LEDs. Fasten the bubble to camera body so that the foam ring and the bubble are attached seamlessly.

2.1 Install the Memory Card

Type I and II support memory card installation and the steps are similar.

Steps:

1. Disassemble the camera to uninstall the adapter plate, bubble and black liner from the camera in order.

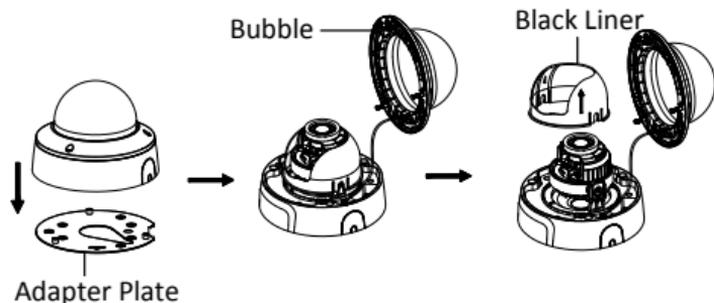


Figure 2-1 Disassemble the Camera

2. Rotate the camera body to completely expose the memory card slot.
3. Insert the memory card into the memory card slot, and push to get it mounted.

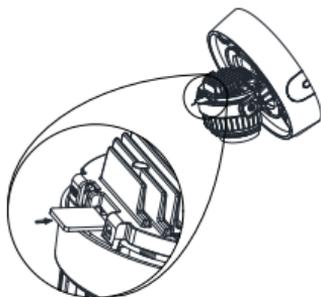


Figure 2-2 Install the Memory Card

4. (Optional) To unmount the memory card, push to eject it.

2.2 Camera Mounting

Before you start:

The installation steps of type I camera and type II camera are similar. Before the camera installation, disassemble the camera to uninstall the adapter plate, bubble and black liner from the camera in order.

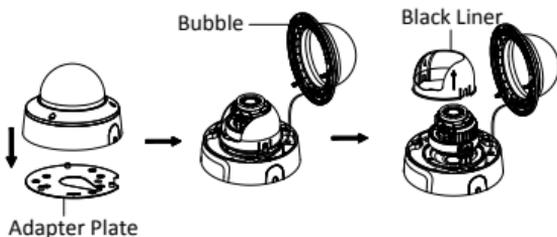


Figure 2-3 Disassemble the Camera

2.2.1 Ceiling Mounting

Steps:

1. Install the adapter plate to the ceiling with the screws.

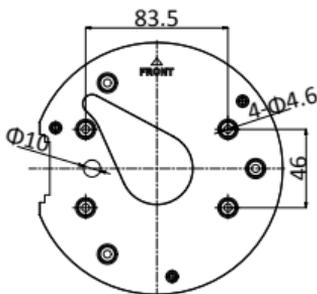


Figure 2-4 The Size of the Screw Holes

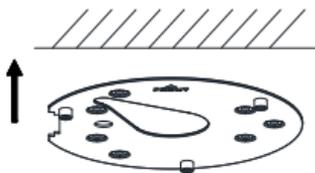


Figure 2-5 Install the Adapter Plate

2. Drill screw holes according to the adapter plate.
3. (Optional) If you want to route the cables inside the ceiling, drill a cable hole in the ceiling according to the adapter plate.
4. Route and connect the cables.
5. Align the holes and secure the camera with the supplied screws.

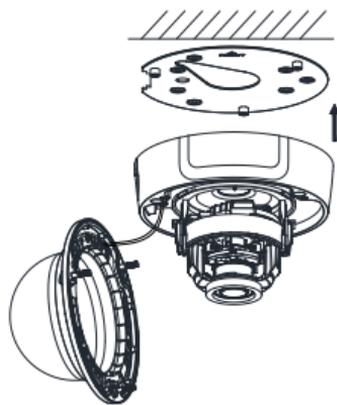


Figure 2-6 Secure the Camera

6. Rotate the lens to adjust the surveillance angle.

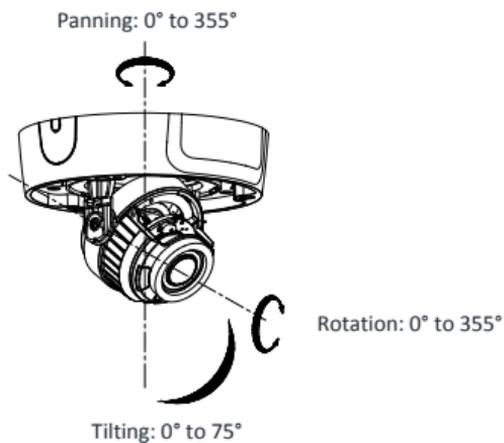


Figure 2-7 Adjust the Angle

7. Adjust the zoom and focus. Refer to Chapter 2.3 for the detailed information.
8. Install the inner black liner back to the camera.
9. Install the bubble back to the camera and secure it with screws.

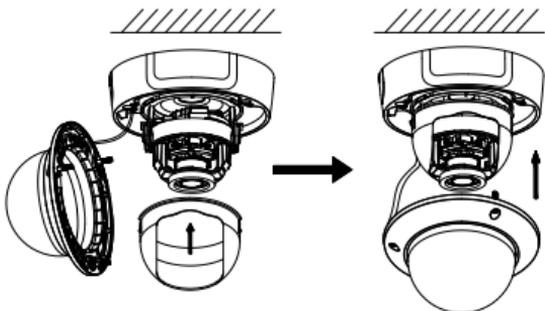


Figure 2-8 Secure Black Liner and Bubble

2.2.2 Wall Mounting

Before you start:

A wall mounting bracket is needed for the wall mounting and should be purchased separately. For the recommended models of the bracket, consult the technical support.

Steps:

1. Route the cables, install the mounting bracket on the wall, and secure the cap on the bracket.

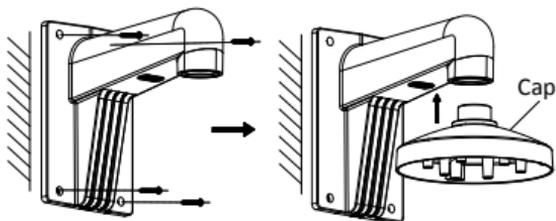


Figure 2-9 Install the Wall Mount Bracket

2. Install the adapter plate to the cap with screws.

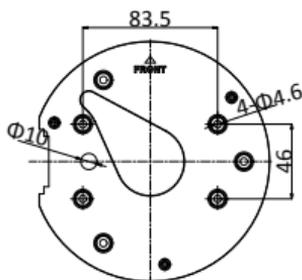


Figure 2-10 The Size of the Screw Holes

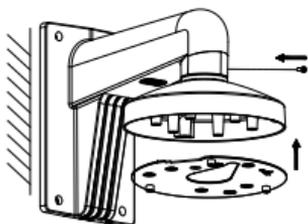


Figure 2-11 Install the Adapter Plate

3. Align the holes and secure the camera with the supplied screws.

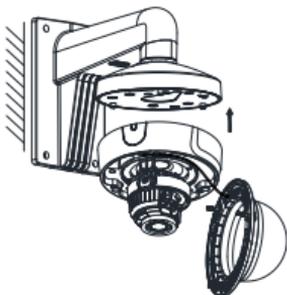


Figure 2-12 Secure the Camera

4. Rotate the lens to adjust the surveillance angle.

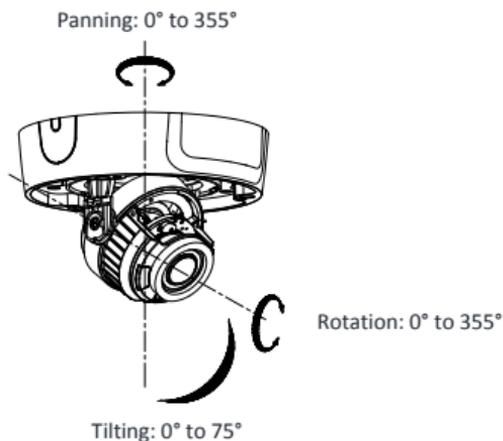


Figure 2-13 Adjust the Angle

5. Adjust the zoom and focus. Refer to Chapter 2.3 for the detailed information.
6. Install the inner black liner back to the camera.
7. Secure the bubble to the camera with screws.

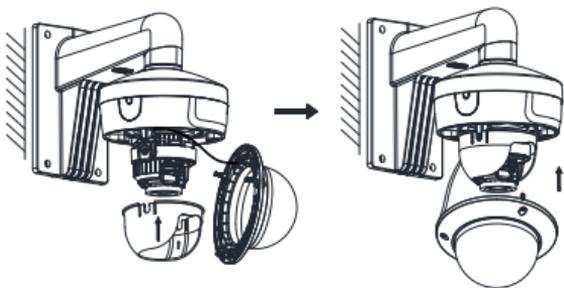


Figure 2-14 Secure Black Liner and Bubble

2.2.3 Pendant Mounting

Before you start:

A pendant mounting bracket is needed for the pendant mounting and should be purchased separately. For the recommended models of the bracket, consult the technical support.

Steps:

1. Route the cables, install the mounting bracket, and secure the cap on the bracket.

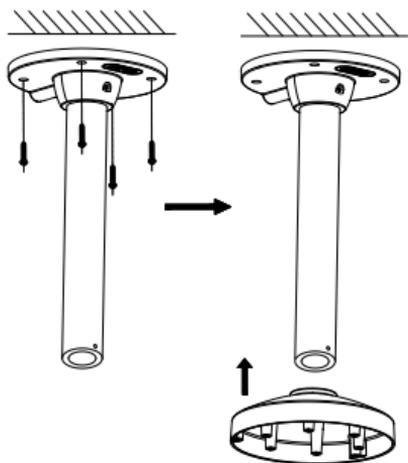


Figure 2-15 Install the Mount Bracket

2. Install the adapter plate to the cap with screws.

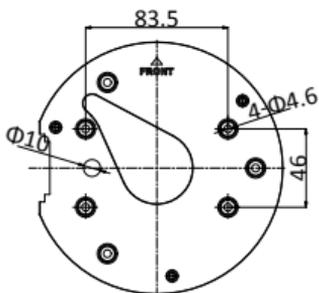


Figure 2-16 The Size of the Screw Holes

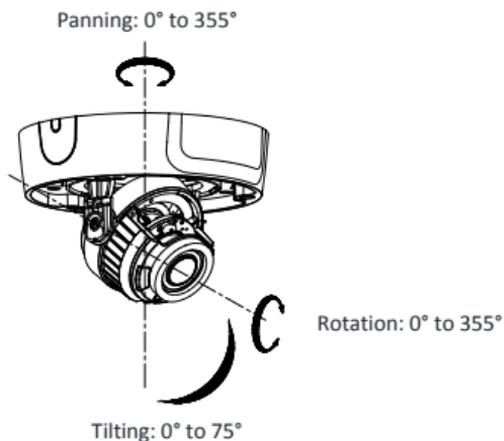


Figure 2-19 Adjust the Angle

5. Adjust the zoom and focus. Refer to Chapter 2.3 for the detailed information.
6. Install the inner black liner back to the camera.
7. Secure the bubble to the camera with screws.

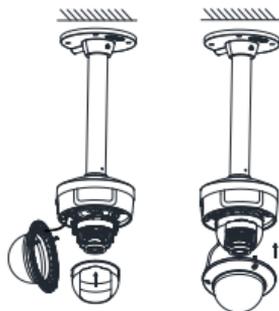


Figure 2-20 Secure Black Liner and Bubble

2.3 Adjust Zoom and Focus

2.3.1 Manually Adjustment

Certain camera models have the lens that zoom and focus must be manually adjusted via zoom/focus lever. Use the zoom lever and focus lever to adjust the zoom and focus.

Steps:

1. Loosen the zoom lever and move the lever between T (Tele) and W (Wide) to obtain the appropriate angle of view.

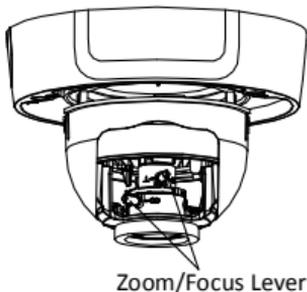


Figure 2-21 Zoom/Focus Lever

2. Tighten the zoom lever.
3. Loosen the focus lever and move the lever between F (Far) and N (Near) to obtain the optimum focus.
4. Tighten the focus lever.

2.3.2 Motor-Driven Lens

Some camera models are equipped with a motor-driven lens. Adjust the zoom and focus on PTZ control panel by visiting the camera via web browser or client software.

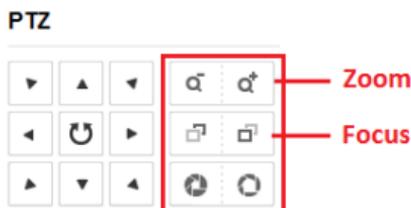


Figure 2-22 Zoom and Focus Adjustment via Web Browser

2.4 (Optional) Installation of Network Cable Waterproof Jacket

Purpose:

If the camera is installed outdoor, you can use the waterproof accessory for the network cable after the camera is secured on the installation surface.

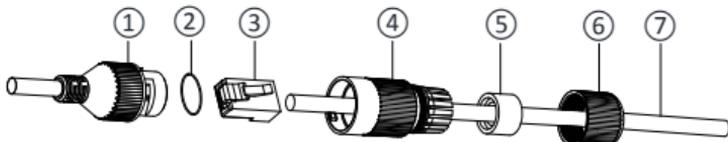


Figure 2-23 Waterproof Accessory Components

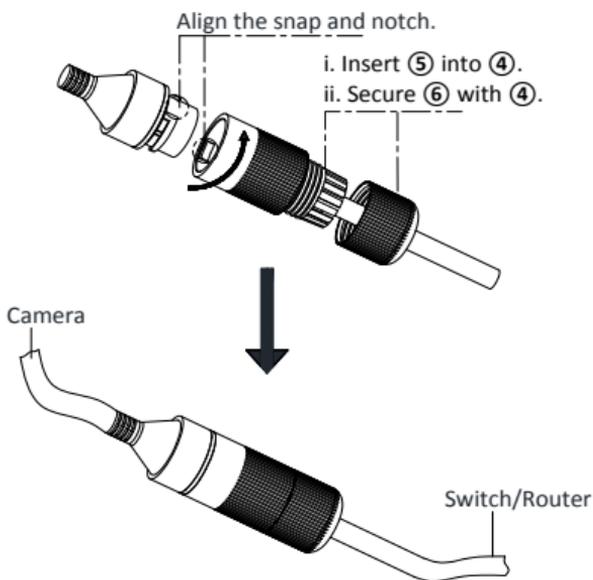

Steps:

1. Feed the plugless network cable ⑦ through the lock nut ⑥, waterproof rubber gasket ⑤ (the rubber gasket inset ridge must face the waterproof endcap), and the waterproof endcap ④ in order.
2. Crimp an RJ-45 network plug ③ onto the end of the cable, taking care to insert the twisted pairs of wires in correct order.
3. Place the O-type gasket ② onto the end of the camera's network interface socket ①.
4. Insert the network plug ③ into the camera's network interface socket ①.

5. Insert the waterproof rubber gasket (5) into the waterproof endcap (4), and secure lock nut (6) with the waterproof endcap (4).
6. Align the snap on the waterproof endcap (4) with the notch on the camera's network interface socket (1), and then secure the waterproof endcap (4) to the camera's network interface socket (1) to finish installation.



3 Set the Network Camera over the LAN

Note:

You shall acknowledge that the use of the product with Internet access might be under network security risks. For avoidance of any network attacks and information leakage, strengthen your own protection.

If the product does not work properly, contact your dealer or the nearest service center for help.

3.1 Wiring

Connect the camera to network according to the following figures.

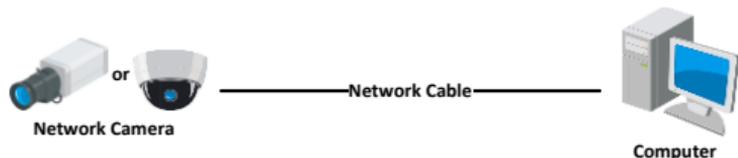


Figure 3-1 Connect Directly

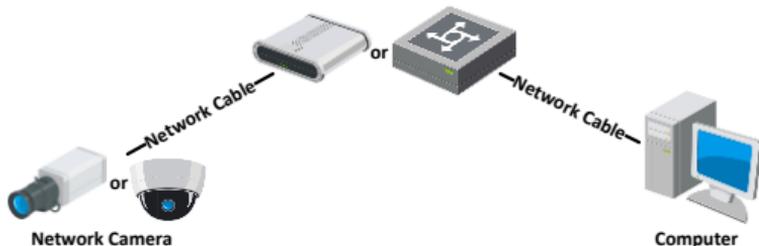


Figure 3-2 Connect via a Switch or a Router

3.2 Activate the Camera

You are required to activate the camera first by setting a strong password for it before you can use the camera.

Activation via web browser, activation via SADP, and activation via client software are all supported. We will take activation via SADP software and activation via web browser as examples to introduce the camera activation.

Note:

Refer to the User Manual of Network Camera for the details about activation via client software.

3.2.1 Activation via Web Browser

Steps:

1. Power on the camera. Connect the camera to your computer or the switch/router which your computer connects to.
2. Input the IP address into the address bar of the web browser, and press **Enter** to enter the activation interface.

Notes:

- The default IP address of the camera is 192.168.1.64.
- The computer and the camera should belong to the same subnet.
- For the camera enables the DHCP by default, you need to use the SADP software to search the IP address.

3. Create a password and input the password into the password field.



STRONG PASSWORD RECOMMENDED– *We highly recommend you create a strong password of your own choosing (using a minimum of 8 characters, including upper case letters, lower case letters, numbers, and special characters) in order to increase the security of your product. And we recommend you reset your password regularly, especially in the high security system, resetting the password monthly or weekly can better protect your product.*

4. Confirm the password.
5. Click **OK**.

3.2.2 Activation via SADP Software

SADP software is used for detecting the online device, activating the camera, and resetting the password.

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Get the SADP software from the supplied disk or the official website, and install the SADP according to the prompts.

Follow the steps to activate the camera.

Steps:

1. Run the SADP software to search the online devices.
2. Check the device status from the device list, and select the inactive device.

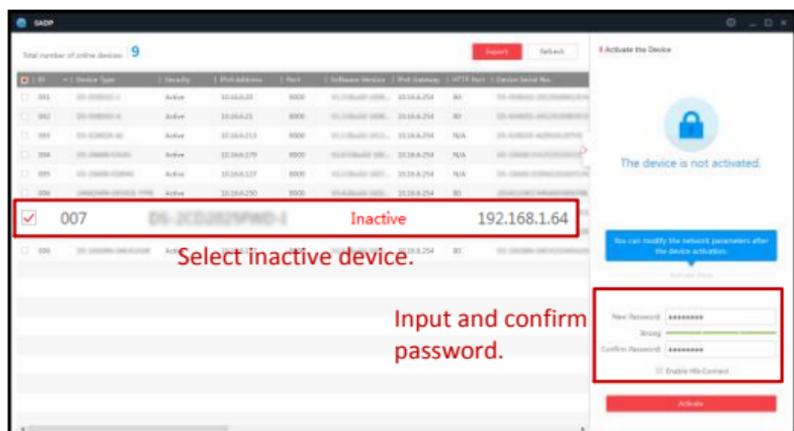


Figure 3-4 SADP Interface

Note:

The SADP software supports activating the camera in batch. Refer to the user manual of SADP software for details.

3. Create and input the new password in the password field, and confirm the password.

Note:

You can enable the Hik-Connect service for the device during activation. Refer to Chapter 5.1 for detailed information.

4. Click **Activate** to start activation.

You can check whether the activation is completed on the popup window. If activation failed, make sure that the password meets the requirement and try again.

3.3 Modify the IP Address

Purpose:

To view and configure the camera via LAN (Local Area Network), you need to connect the network camera in the same subnet with your PC.

Use the SADP software or client software to search and change the IP address of the device. We take modifying the IP Address via SADP software as an example to introduce the IP address modification.

For IP address modification via client software, refer to the user manual of client software.

Steps:

1. Run the SADP software.
2. Select an active device.
3. Change the device IP address to the same subnet with your computer by either modifying the IP address manually or checking **Enable DHCP**.

4. Input the admin password and click **Modify** to activate your IP address modification.

The batch IP address modification is supported by the SADP. Refer to the user manual of SADP for details.

4 Access via Web Browser

System Requirement:

Operating System: Microsoft Windows XP SP1 and later version

CPU: 2.0 GHz or higher

RAM: 1G or higher

Display: 1024×768 resolution or higher

Web Browser: Internet Explorer 8.0 and later version, Apple Safari 5.0.2 and later version, Mozilla Firefox 5.0 and later version and Google Chrome 18 and later version

Steps:

1. Open the web browser.
2. In the browser address bar, input the IP address of the network camera, and press the **Enter** key to enter the login interface.

Note:

The default IP address is 192.168.1.64. You are recommended to change the IP address to the same subnet with your computer.

3. Input the user name and password.

The admin user should configure the device accounts and user/operator permissions properly. Delete the unnecessary accounts and user/operator permissions.

Note:

The device IP address gets locked if the admin user performs 7 consecutive failed password attempts (5 attempts for the user/operator).

4. Click **Login**.

5. Install the plug-in before viewing the live video and managing the camera. Follow the installation prompts to install the plug-in.

Note:

You may have to close the web browser to finish the installation of the plug-in.

6. Reopen the web browser after the installation of the plug-in and repeat steps 2 to 4 to login.

5 Operate via Hik-Connect App

Purpose:

Hik-Connect is an application for mobile devices. With the App, you can view live image of the camera, receive alarm notification and so on.

Note:

Hik-Connect service is not supported by certain camera models.

5.1 Enable Hik-Connect Service on Camera

Purpose:

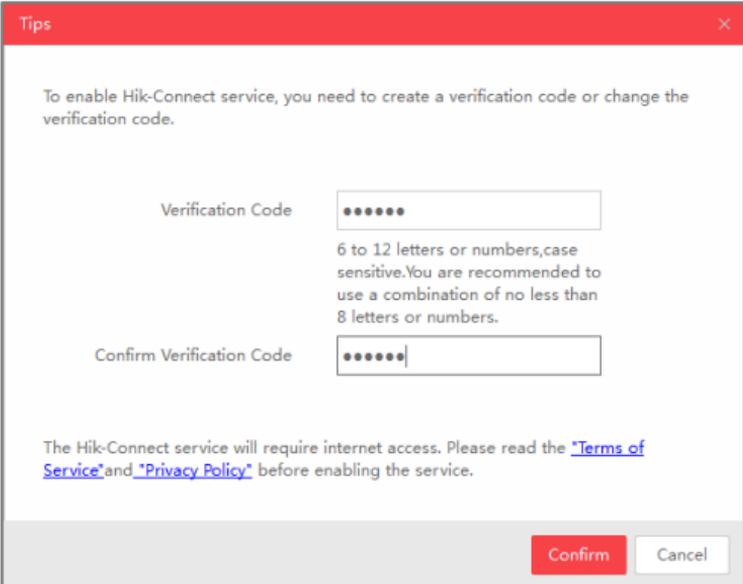
Hik-Connect service should be enabled on your camera before using the service.

You can enable the service through SADP software or web browser.

5.1.1 Enable Hik-Connect Service via SADP Software

Steps:

1. Check **Enable Hik-Connect**:
 - 1). "Activate the Device" page during camera activation, refer to Chapter 3.2.2.
 - 2). Or "Modify Network Parameters" page during modifying IP address, refer to Chapter 3.3.
2. Create a verification code or change the verification code.

5.1.2 Enable Hik-Connect Service via Web Browser

Before you start:

You need to activate the camera before enabling the service. Refer to Chapter 3.2.

1. Access the camera via web browser. Refer to Chapter 4.
2. Enter platform access configuration interface: **Configuration > Network > Advanced Settings > Platform Access.**

3. Select **Hik-Connect** from the **Platform Access Mode** drop-down list.
4. Check **Enable**.
5. Click and read "Terms of Service" and "Privacy Policy" in pop-up window.
6. Create a verification code or change the verification code for the camera.

Note:

The verification code is required when you add the camera to Hik-Connect app.

7. Save the settings.

5.2 Hik-Connect Setup

Steps:

1. Download and install the Hik-Connect app by searching “Hik-Connect” in App Store or Google Play™.
2. Launch the app and register for a Hik-Connect user account.
3. Log in Hik-Connect app after registration.

5.3 Add Camera to Hik-Connect

Before you start:

You need to enable the Hik-Connect service on camera before adding it to your Hik-Connect account. Refer to Chapter 5.1.

Steps:

1. Use a network cable to connect the camera with a router if the camera does not support Wi-Fi.

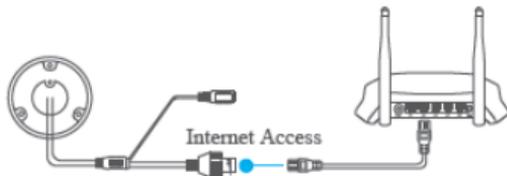


Figure 5-3 Connect a Router

Note:

After the camera connects to the network, wait one minute before any operation on the camera using Hik-Connect app.

2. In the Hik-Connect app, tap “+” on the upper-right corner and then scan the QR code of the camera to add the camera.

You can find the QR code on the camera or on the cover of the Quick Start Guide of the camera in the package.

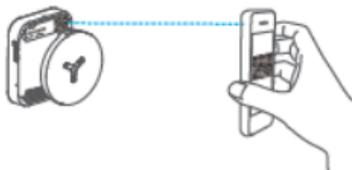


Figure 5-4 Scan QR Code

Note:

If the QR code is missing or too blur to be recognized, you can also add the camera by tapping  and inputting the camera's serial number.

3. Input the verification code of your camera.

Note:

- The required verification code is the code you create or change when you enabling Hik-Connect service on camera.
- If you forget the verification code, you can check the current verification code on **Platform Access** configuration page via web browser.

4. Follow the prompts to set the network connection and add the camera to your Hik-Connect account.

Note:

For detailed information, refer to the user manual of the Hik-Connect app.

5.4 Initialize the Memory Card

Steps:

Check the memory card status by tapping on the Storage Status in the Device Settings interface.

If the memory card status displays as Uninitialized, tap to initialize it. The status will then change to Normal. You can then start recording any event triggered video in the camera such as motion detection.
