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Setting up

Inserting a SIM card, microSD card, and the battery

- 1 Remove the phone's cover.
- 2 Insert the SIM card with the gold-coloured contacts facing down.
- **3** Open the microSD card cover by sliding (①) and then lifting up (②).
- 4 Put the microSD card with the gold-coloured contacts facing down, close the microSD card cover (①), and then gently slide the cover (②).
- 5 Insert the battery (1) and lower it into the phone (2), then attach the cover (3).











Important:

- When removing the battery, make sure you turn off the phone first.
- To avoid loss of data or malfunction, do not damage, carelessly handle, or short-circuit the gold-coloured contacts of the SIM card or microSD card.

- Use only the battery specified.
- Wipe the battery ends (⊕, ⊝), SIM card, and microSD card with a dry cloth.
- Avoid touching the battery ends (\oplus, \bigcirc) or the unit contacts.

For your safety

MARNING

Power connection

- Use only the power source marked on the product.
- Do not overload power outlets and extension cords. This can result in the risk of fire or electric shock.
- Completely insert the AC adaptor into the power outlet. Failure to do so may cause electric shock and/or excessive heat resulting in a fire.
- Regularly remove any dust, etc. from the AC adaptor by pulling it from the power outlet, then wiping with a dry cloth. Accumulated dust may cause an insulation defect from moisture, etc. resulting in a fire.
- Unplug the product from power outlets and remove the battery from the phone if it emits smoke, an abnormal smell, or makes an unusual noise. These conditions can cause fire or electric shock. Confirm that smoke has stopped emitting and contact an authorised service centre.

Installation

- This product is not water-resistant. To prevent the risk of fire or electrical shock, do not expose the product to rain or any type of moisture.

- This product emits radio waves and may cause interference to other electronic devices.
- Do not allow the AC adaptor to be excessively pulled, bent or placed under heavy objects.
- To prevent serious damage to this product, avoid strong impacts and rough handling.
- To avoid damage or malfunction, do not modify the SIM card or microSD card or touch the card's gold-coloured contacts.

Battery

- Use only the battery specified.
- Risk of explosion if battery is replaced with an incorrect type. Dispose of used batteries according to the instructions.
- Do not open, puncture, crush, or drop the battery. A damaged battery must not be used. This can result in the risk of fire, explosion, overheating, and leaking of the electrolyte.
- Stop using the battery immediately and keep away from fire if it emits an abnormal smell or leaks electrolyte. Released electrolyte may cause fire or burns.
- Do not touch released electrolyte if the battery leaks. It may cause burns or injury to the eyes

- Do not place magnetic cards or similar objects near the phone. Magnetic data on cash cards, credit cards, telephone cards and floppy disks, etc. may be deleted.
- Do not put magnetic substances close to the phone. Strong magnetism might affect operation.

SAR

This model meets international guidelines and EU requirements for exposure to radio waves. Your wireless device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed not to exceed radio wave exposure limits recommended by international guidelines. These guidelines were developed by the independent scientific organisation ICNIRP and include safety margins designed to assure. The protection of all persons, regardless of age and health. These guidelines also form the basis of international regulations and standards on RF Exposure.

The guidelines use a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit for wireless devices is 2 W/kg.
